Online learning

Expectations for students, parents, school, teachers

Overview:

For parents opting to access school from home, it is essential you read and understand the expectations of roles and responsibilities. It is the position of the Oneida School District that the optimum educational setting consists of interaction with a teacher in a physical classroom. We understand there may be some high-risk circumstances where it is not prudent for a student to attend a physical classroom setting. If this is the case, the following expectations are in place to ensure that maximum student learning can be appropriately facilitated.

Roles and Responsibilities:

Parents:

- Safe Internet access
- Access to online instruction during school hours
- Learning support – structured routines, distraction-free learning environment, monitor homework, and attendance.

Students:

- School attendance at classes/school hours via zoom and/or LMS and/or timely assignment completion
- Full engagement with the class.
- Timely assignment completion/turn-in.

- Access online LMS, Zoom instruction, and put forth academic activity to stay current with brick and mortar classroom

School:

- Essential learning standards will be taught
- Rigor/grading same as physical classroom expectations
- Chromebook access
- Internet access in school parking lots
- Provide teacher access via Zoom

Teachers:

- All necessary learning materials posted on LMS
- All direct instruction zoomed from the classroom (or learning support resources) will be accessible.
- Response to email within 24 hours during the school week.

Attendance policy:

All online students will be expected to participate daily (school days) in necessary learning activities. Attendance may be taken by various methods (virtual attendance during instructional times or timely turning in of assignments) according to the course and grade level. Students not in attendance will be marked truant. Efforts will be made by the school to encourage attendance. Truant (educational neglect) charges may be filed if truancy continues. Students not attending after ten days will be unenrolled from school.
